CHAIRMANS REPORT 2010/2011

During the last twelve months we have seen the Truthan Barton Windfarm application turned down by Cornwall Council and also by the Planning Inspectorate in December; where many parishioners spoke passionately about their fears and concerns. I would like to thank Lynda Quee for speaking at County Hall and Cllr Sally Jones who at short notice spoke at the Planning Inquiry on behalf of the council. Well done to both of you. However since then a new application has been submitted by Coronation Power, minus the two turbines to the east of the A39.

The Wainhomes development has now begun at Trispen Hill and I believe we have managed to build a working relationship with them and have met the site manager on a number of occasions to discuss issues with the site. They have so far been very helpful and hopefully this will continue. We have met with highways to see if we can improve the bus stop at Chapel Road to make it safer, this is currently in discussion and hopefully a solution will be agreed by all.

The new Community Centre is finally finished with your support through the parish council's grant of £80,000. This facility will benefit local groups and parishioners, as well as providing facilities for the Cricket and Football teams.

The council was asked by Cornwall Council to pilot a Community Emergency Plan for the parish. This has now been completed by the coordinators of the plan. This will be used as a first response in an emergency until the emergency services arrive. Thank you to all who have put forward their contact details for our database and offered their services/skills in such an event. Also thank you to the Emergency Plan Committee who have given their time to put this plan together, and who will act as coordinators in such an event.

We are in the process of looking at producing a Village Design Statement for the parish which will possibly lead into a Neighbourhood Plan. It is very important that everyone gets involved, as these documents will highlight the character settlements and assets that you as parishioners feel is important to safe guard and keep in the future; during the natural growth of our parish.

I would like to thank Sally our clerk for all the hours she puts in and also the councillors who give their time and commitment. Sadly Lynda Quee has had to hand her in her resignation, and I am sorry to see her go, as she has contributed a lot in her time as a councillor, and I wish her all the best.
