### **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**

I would like to start by welcoming two new members to the council, Cllr Edwin Riggs and Cllr Patricia Couch who have settled in well.

This last year we have seen the Neighbourhood Plan progressing well moving forward to the next stage. We would like it to be completed and adopted by early 2019. It is important for you to follow the progress and attend and comment on the forthcoming consultations. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Steering Group for their work and commitment so far on this process.

As stated last year the defibrillator outside of Trispen Post Office & Stores is in place and this year the Emergency Plan Committee have held several informal training and awareness events on CPR and the use of defibrillators.

We have had a mix of planning applications over the last twelve months and have seen the start of the Burrington's development taking shape.

The offsite open space s106 monies from the Truthan View development was transferred to the parish council following extensive consultation with the community and is now in place with a range of equipment for all ages. There is outside gym equipment and a small range of toddler equipment at the football ground and junior equipment at the school playing field. We have also purchased litterbins and seating for the Church yard, Truthan View and the football and cricket grounds. I am pleased to say that we have received many good comments and the equipment is proving to be very popular.

We have continued with our partnership agreements with Cornwall Council for the Street Cleansing, grass and public rights of way maintenance and are still also carrying out our own weed treatments of the village.

We continue to serve the community to the best of our ability and listen and take on board comments and opinions received about various issues in the parish. It is important that you continue to express your opinions and attend any consultations through out the year; so we can represent the interests of the whole community.

I would like to thank the clerk, members and Cllr Eathorne-Gibbons (Cornwall Councillor) for all their hard work and commitment over the last twelve months.
