

Methodist Musings: Surprised by Christmas

Dear Friends

Are you the sort of person who looks forward to Christmas with excitement and joy? Are you blown away by the wonder of the season of Advent, Christmas and Epiphany? Do you look forward to surprises? Whether in gifts or visitors; cards, phone calls or messages – from around the corner and across the world? It is possible that for some of us Christmas and all the preparations before and the events after are just another part of each passing year? So is it getting more difficult to be surprised by Christmas?

Yet the real Christmas, the first Christmas, the birth of Christ, was a surprise. God hadn't been speaking to His people through the prophets for many a long year. All was silent. Then, in God's perfect timing, Jesus was born. God became incarnate, made flesh, fully human, yet fully divine. And whilst this incredible event was announced with splendour and brilliance it was to a lowly group of farmers up on a hill. And it sent them running to see what had happened in that shelter in Bethlehem. To those close by that animal shelter and to you and me as this Christmas draws near, the sound of God speaking His message of love and salvation came in the cry of a newborn baby. With all the vulnerability and fragility of new life God was born! How surprising is this! No great fanfare or sweeping in of an all-powerful angelic army to bring us shouting with joy or screaming with terror back to God. Rather an innocent baby's cry breaks into the silence of a lost world. And the good news is we are loved, we are precious to God and God has come to save us. Surprise! It's Christmas!

In the prologue to the gospel bearing his name John writes about Jesus as the Word of God in this way and it is as surprising as it is wonderful:

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God...in him was life, and the life was the light of all people...And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth." (John 1:1, 4 & 14)


