So, on the theme of environment - the Funday AGM was at the end of January. This magazine is funded by the Funday Committee and whether a printed version is valuable was again discussed. We did a questionnaire some time ago and had limited responses however those who did reply were largely in favour of keeping a printed magazine. Those members of the community who attend groups such as the WI, Silver Circle etc will be asked for their opinions by members of the Funday Committee so I thought it might be useful to outline how this publication is created to help you if you are asked about whether the magazine is valuable. Every stage of the process is done by volunteers. The only cost is the printing but the magazine does make a loss with the advertising not covering the costs of printing. Additionally the committee will look at whether there should be a change to the advertising costs.

So this is what we aim for and why it takes a while from entries deadline to the finished printed document arriving on your doormat:

Day 1 (Deadline day) - Contributions are sent to the editor, by the deadline (mostly)!

Day 2 - Some contributions require conversion - these are sent to the printers who do this free of charge and usually the same day.

Days 3, 4,& 5 - The entries are patched together to make the publication a multiple of 4 pages. It can be a bit like doing a jigsaw puzzle with pieces missing. (This usually takes 3 or 4 days but depends what else I've got going on).

Day 6 - The draft magazine is sent to the Funday committee and Proofreaders.

Day 8 & 9 - The magazine is sent to the Printers in North Cornwall who print and deliver by Courier.

Days 10 - 14 The magazine is delivered to a band of willing volunteers who in turn deliver the printed final document to you.

Annually, the Treasurer invoices all advertisers from the past year.

#### **IMMINENT CLOSURE**

I guess it is not a new concern of the modern age that the minority always spoil it for the majority but a problem that has always been present with us.

Farmers have been privileged over the years for being allowed to apply for permission to apply for a licence to enable them to burn hedge trimmings. Having lived on the edge of the village of Trispen all of my life, we as a family have tried to share with the community some of the privileges we enjoy living on a farm.

For a large number of years we have had a bonfire site in the field on the left of the lane leading to Tregassow. Over many years we have allowed members of the local community to bring their garden cuttings there to be burnt on a weekly basis. Unfortunately over the years this facility has been greatly abused by a minority of people. We have had cookers, fridges, washing machines, car parts, mattresses, sofas, bags of cement and concrete blocks. All of which are obviously non burnable and we then have to dispose of them.

Since Christmas [written on the 18<sup>th</sup> January] we have had bags of household rubbish, all of which get split and the contents have to be picked up by hand including nappies. A black bag full of bottles, a black bag full of tins, again split and now have to be picked up for recycling, a quantity of carpet and underlay and three lumps of concrete too heavy for me to lift.

Why should we continue to offer this facility to the village when this type of abuse is taking place on a regular basis? Disappointing to many I know, but also disappointing to us, as a family.

The facility will remain open for the time being to allow everyone to start to make alternative arrangements for their garden waste disposal.


of farm machinery made from fruit and veg instead!

#### Good news!

One in three people worldwide don't have a loo; by supporting this scheme, we are helping to flush away poverty, and all for £65! Individuals, as well as groups, can do this.

**March** sees us wending our way through Lent, and the daffodils and tulips are a glorious reminder of the resurrected life we shall celebrate on Easter Day.

**Lent Lunches** will take place in the Village Hall, with a little help from our friends, on 5 Wednesdays from 21 st Feb.  $-21^{st}$  March, 12.30 p.m.

The School Choir will help us prepare for Easter with a Service in Church on Wednesday, 28<sup>th</sup> March, at 6.00 p.m. We're so pleased to welcome them again and that we don't have to wait till Christmas for them to visit. Everyone welcome.

And our forgiveness also depends on another part of the story of the cross: our hollow chocolate **Easter eggs** remind us of the empty cross and the empty grave. After paying the ultimate price, Jesus' body was taken down from the cross and laid in a tomb. He was then raised from the dead on the first Easter Sunday - new life that he also shares with us now and through all eternity, resurrection proving all that he had accomplished.

The following information has been sent to the editor with a request for it to be included anonymously. It has been treated as a 'letter to the editor'.

#### WARNING NOTICE

Do you have insurance for your water pipes (external & internal) with a company called HOMESERVE? If so you need to check your current renewal increase. You may be very surprised at the level of increase. We recommend that YOU DO NOT PAY until you have spoken to the company and told them you cannot afford the increase if it is over £10 on the previous year. We do not know what the game is but members of local groups in the village have found vast variations in the policy increase with no added benefits. It does seem pensioners are being ripped off. One member of the Silver Circle was charged £198 and when she refused this increase her bill was reduced within 10 minutes by over £160. Another was charged £99, an increase of £30 on the previous year — They refused to pay and was almost immediately told a £10 increase would be made instead. Others have taken the same route and received discounts to match. We all have water pipe insurance and our policies seem to match and none of us have made any claims but suddenly huge increases have been levied. We need to stand up to this company. The editors have the Writer's details if anyone needs more information but HOMESERVE CUSTOMERS BE WARNED.

Being based locally a majority of our members live in the Feock, Carnon Downs, Truro area.

While we do not give medical advice we are often able to help based on our own experiences and can advise you where best will suit your particular issue. Worried about flying, going abroad or travel insurance? All these things are very possible and we can advise you on this.



#### **Annual Parish Meeting**

The Annual Parish Meeting of St Erme will be held on Tuesday 20th March 2018 at the St Erme Community Centre at 7.30pm.

#### What is the Annual Parish Meeting?

Strictly this is the Annual Meeting of the Parish. It is also known as the Annual Parish Meeting. The Annual Parish Meeting is the meeting where the parish council report to its electorate on what it has accomplished in the preceding year. Electors, public and press are invited to hear reports and updates from the Council. The Council may also invite the local community policeman to address and inform the audience on community matters. Representatives from village organisations or speakers on other bodies may be asked.

The Annual Parish Meeting is a SEPARATE meeting from the Parish Council Annual Meeting. The Annual Parish Meeting should be a relatively informal event for the community whereas the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council is a formal council meeting where they elect the chairman, and make other annual appointments.

This year we are inviting the community Police Officer and a representative from the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group. We will also be launching the Community Benefit requests.

#### **Devon & Cornwall Neighbourhood Watch**



Various watch schemes are running throughout Devon, Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly. These are managed by Devon and Cornwall Community Watch Association (DaCCWA).

A watch scheme is a group of like-minded people getting together to help reduce crime and make their community safer. Neighbourhood Watch covers urban areas, such as cities, towns and villages.

#### Aims of Neighbourhood Watch

- To prevent crime by improving security, increasing vigilance and maintaining a caring community.
- To assist the police in detecting crime by encouraging prompt reporting of criminal or suspicious activity.
- To reduce undue fear of crime by providing accurate information about risks and by promoting a sense of security and community spirit.

To improve communication between police and the community by fostering regular contact and liaison.

#### How the schemes work

- Schemes are run by their members and led by a resident volunteer co-ordinator, whose job it is to get people working together and make sure things get done.
- The scheme co-ordinator liaises with the police and acts as a voice for the community. Some schemes also have a committee that meets regularly to plan which problems to target and what actions to take.
- Schemes are supported by the police, the local authority and their local Neighbourhood Watch Forums.
- Neighbourhood Watch schemes vary in size they can be large, covering most of the houses on an estate, or they may involve just a few houses.


