A member of the public spoke in objection to planning application number PA18/01003.

Cllr Trethewey had declared a non-pecuniary interest on this item and left the room.

The member of the public had concerns over the height of the elevations, the location on the plot and that the proposals would cause an unacceptable loss of light to the property behind the proposed dwelling, which would also leave the same dwelling in shade for most of the day.

The member of the public was thanked and members would take into consideration the comments made when looking at the application.

195/17Councillors to discuss any matters with Cornwall Councillor if present:

Cllr Eathorne-Gibbons had given his apologies and had forwarded the report below:

1. Integration of health and social care. Cabinet colleagues are concerned about the poor financial standing of the main health bodies (commissioners and providers) in Cornwall and are not prepared to support an accountable care system. Instead their view is that the present Health and Well Being Board should be strengthened, continue to be chaired by Leader of Cornwall Council with majority of Clirs as members, and

provide the necessary leadership to health bodies in Cornwall. It seems NHS England is supportive of this approach, with further work being done to clarify finances and budgets.

- 2. Stadium at Langarth. There are presently mixed views about the Cabinet providing financial support to the Stadium. The latest news is that GLL, who looks after the Council's various leisure interests, will now be an active partner in the proposals for the Stadium with their very recent proposed provision of new indoor recreation facilities. It is possible the Government will provide some financial support but if not, Cornwall Council may provide between £4m and £6m toward the present cost of £12m. The difference between the first two figures is due to how one reflects the value of the land the Council is providing for a nominal £1. Cabinet will decide on its final position at the end of this month before the whole issue goes to full Council in May for decision.
- 3. CORMAC Strategic Review. The Consultant undertaking this work has recently completed his studies and is currently preparing his report and recommendations. These are expected to go to CC officers for an initial consideration.

196/17 Clerks Update and Report

Members were notified of all correspondence received and reminded of forthcoming meetings.

Cllr Trethewey had declared a non-pecuniary interest on this item and left the room.

It was proposed and seconded for Cllr Hodgkinson to chair this item.

Members discussed the application and it was

RESOLVED to object to the application for the following reasons:

- 1) The proposed dwelling is too large and would be overdevelopment of the site.
- 2) The elevations of the application are higher than the adjacent dwelling of Laurel Cottage and would be overbearing not only to Laurel Cottage but to 29 Polisken Way.
- 3) The proposed dwelling is too close to 29 Polisken Way and would cause an unacceptable loss of light and overshadowing to the property. The proposed dwelling is only 4.7m at its closest point to 29 Polisken Way.
- 4) The plans are incorrect in stating that 27 Polisken Way has obscure glass in the window facing the proposed property.
- 5) The style and type of property proposed is not in keeping with the area; the existing properties along this road are either bungalows or dormer bungalows and are low level in height.
- 6) The proposed dwelling would be visible from the north and would impose on the natural ridgeline of the settlement boundary.

The proposal is against Policy 12: Design (1a, 2a &2b) and Policy 23: Natural Environment (2) of the Cornwall Local Plan 2010-2030.

Highways England: A30 Chiverton to Carland Cross dual carriageway scheme consultation

This application was discussed and it was agreed to respond to the consultation as follows: St Erme Parish Council are pleased with the new plans for the A30 improvements scheme. We feel that this is a good scheme and well thought out for local people as well as commuters and the business and tourist

We do feel though that it would be good if you could open up Church Lane for pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders, this would be a huge asset to the village of Zelah linking it to the open countryside and our parish (St Erme).

We are also interested to hear the work with Cornwall Council about the Boxheater Scotland Road - Trevemper proposals. This could be the answer to the Henver Lane issues at Zelah. With a clever bit of realigning where Henver Lane meets the B3275 traffic could be put off using Henver Lane as a rat run and choose to go via the Boxheater junction instead.
