

St Erme Parish Neighbourhood Plan Referendum (17 October) - Polling Cards

Cornwall Council has been notified that some residents in St. Erme have not received the poll cards that were sent out for the St. Erme Neighbourhood Plan Referendum taking place on 17 October.

We posted the poll cards in good time and we're investigating why they've not been delivered but in the meantime, we want to remind you that you don't need a poll card to be able to vote in the referendum.

Anybody eligible to vote who comes to St. Erme Village Hall (TR4 9BJ) on 17 October anytime between 7am and 10pm will be able to vote, you don't need to bring anything with you.

If you aren't able to attend, you may be able to appoint somebody as a proxy to cast your ballot for you if you apply by 5pm on Wednesday 9 October. However it is too late now to register to vote by post.

The question on the referendum paper will be

'Do you want Cornwall Council to use the neighbourhood plan for St. Erme to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?'

We're sorry if you haven't received your poll card and hopefully it will arrive between now and 17 October but if it doesn't arrive, please don't let that put you off voting to decide this important question.
