We held a consultation on 25th January 2020 regarding extending the speed limits further along Trispen Hill and reducing the speed limit to 20mph within the main areas of the village. This also included a 'Village Gateway' at Trispen Hill.

Thank you to those that supported the event and responded to the consultation.

It was good the see that the responses showed 100% support for the preferred scheme put forward by the Parish Council.

Our scheme will be considered by the Truro & Roseland Community Network Area as part of their Highways Projects.

If successful this will then go to a full Highways Statutory Consultation.

The Annual Parish Meeting of St Erme will be held on Tuesday 17th March 2020 at the St Erme Community Centre at 7.30pm.


What is the Annual Parish Meeting?

Follow these simple steps to prevent delaying our service

If you have a fire hydrant outside your home, try to avoid parking over it as we may need it quickly day or night.

Make sure your home is clearly numbered and visible from the street. You never know when we might need to find it.



If your street or road sign is broken or vandalised. inform your local council to get it repaired.



When parking, please ensure you have left enough room for a fire engine to pass. A fire engine measures 2.6m (6ft 6in) wide and 10m long (32ft 6in).

If you do not leave enough room, the emergency service will be delayed in getting to the emergency and lives may be at risk because you parked inconsiderately.

The Climate Change Act (2008) made the UK the first country to establish a long-term legally binding framework to cut carbon emissions. It contains a target requiring emissions reductions by at least 100% by 2050. To limit the most damaging impacts of climate change, we need to reduce greenhouse gas emissions globally. A wider legal commitment - The Paris Agreement also exists, spanning the UK, the EU and globally, to address climate change.

But it will take more than just legislation to ensure we tackle the problem. There are significant benefits of the UK acting now to reduce its emission. We can make a start to address some areas within our community
