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## Annual Parish Meeting

We held our Annual Parish meeting on 19th March 2019 at the St Erme Community Centre. The chairman gave a report on the last year. This will be available within our Annual Report which will be distributed with the July issue of the Parish Post.

Bart from Burrington's Estates gave an update on the development at Trispen Meadows . Building works are still on schedule and due to be completed by the end of the year. Members of the public were given the opportunity to ask questions or raise any issues.

Although no members present mentioned the off site parking issues, Bart stated that he knew there had been some concerns over the site entrance which they had addressed.

The chairman commended Bart on how tidy their site was and that other than few minor issues the parish council had not received any complaints.

It was good to hear that Burrington' Estates have been involved with the local school with sponsorship and had supported the Fun Day's 'It's a Knock Out' and the village Christmas lights.

Members of the parish council will be meeting with Burrington's to discuss the new footpath from the Trispen Meadows junction to the village at Trispen Hill and the pedestrian crossing at Eglos Road.

Several local people have purchased properties and benefited from the social housing; along with new residents which we welcome to our community.

Following the meeting the St Erme WI served refreshments which were enjoyed by all.

### SCHOOL PLAYING FIELD

We have removed one of the cradle swings at school playing field for safety reasons and will be purchasing a replacement as soon as possible.

The council are in the process of registering ownership of the grass verge by the gate into the field at the School Lane entrance; as we would like to put a footpath into the field for better access for all as this entrance is well used.



# St Erme Neighbourhood Development Plan

Following the Legal Compliance check the draft plan is currently in the middle of Cornwall Council's six week statutory consultation which ends on the 16th May 2019. The plan and supporting documents have been published on Cornwall Council's website and hard copies are available to view at Trispen Post Office and Stores and at the St Erme Community Centre.

Once the six week statutory consultation ends, the Neighbourhood Planning documents and the consultation responses are sent to the appointed independent examiner to begin the examination process. The timescale for the examination process varies depending on each individual Neighbourhood Plan. If the Examiner considers that issues being raised warrant an informal hearing, the process will take longer. During the Examination, Cornwall Council liaises with the appointed independent examiner and keeps the town or parish council informed during the process.

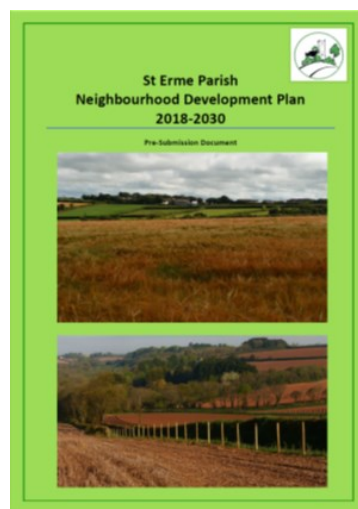
The Examiner produces a draft examination report which is submitted to Cornwall Council to fact check liaising with the town or parish council before the document is finalised and can be published. Then Cornwall Council in consultation with the parish council make any necessary changes to the plan proposal as set out by the Examiner before the plan is signed off by the Portfolio Holder for Planning and can proceed to Referendum.
