Cllr Glasson said that she is looking forward to working with us over the next few years. Cllr Glasson stated that she has an interest in campaigning to reduce speeds limits in villages and had noted that this is something we are currently looking at within our parish. Cllr Glasson will provide the council with a written report each month to update us on her work and Cornwall Council's.

We have received an update stating that the proposed timescales are going out to consultation in May (post elections) and anticipated commencement of works in November.

Mark O'Brien said that he has not seen any revised plans but will check if they include the changes we requested. Mark stated that we will have a chance another chance to respond to the statutory consultation.

b) 'Interactive Speed 'signage for the Parish

Cllr Hodgkinson, Cllr P Jones and the Clerk met to look at the locations for the 'mobile speed signs at the agreed locations. The form has been submitted to highways for consideration and we are waiting to hear back.

c) Emeregency access road through Killigrew Gardens - Consultation

Code of Conduct Training

The clerk reminded members that they are all required to attend Code of Conduct training within 6 months of appointment.

Cllr S Jones, Cllr P Jones and Cllr Hodgkinson will be attending the remote training being held by Cornwall Council during May.

Cllr Trethewey, Cllr Riggs, Cllr Light and Cllr Barnes will be attending the remote training on 28th July 2021 being held by the Cornwall Association of Local Council's at a cost of £20.00 per delegate.

Members were informed of all correspondences received and reminded of forthcoming meetings and training events.

They are currently considering opening up the larder further with drop-in sessions rather than appointments. It was suggested that the larder consider promoting itself in terms of helping to reduce food waste, which may open the larder up further to those that may be reluctant to attend.

45/21 To receive further advice from the Cornwall Association of Local Council's regarding the return to physical meetings and agree any changes for the delivery of COVID secure meetings and delegation procedures.

Members had received copies of the document received by the Cornwall Association of Local Council's on the return to physical meetings & 'Delivering COVID 19 Secure Meetings'. It was felt that we should meet face to face as per our normal schedule of meetings, but that we should put provisions in place for delegation in case of a local COVID -19 outbreak or if government guidelines change. A risk assessment and procedures have already been put in place for face to face meetings. Members of the public are asked to register to attend a meeting or to forward any comments to the clerk that they wish to make on any agenda items.

It was agreed to adopt a broad scheme of delegation to the clerk, this will allow the Council to be able to continue to operate between meetings if we were unable to meet face to face. This will only be used as an emergency measure, when meeting would be inappropriate, unsafe, or impossible. Providing we meet at least three further times during the year, without a 6-month gap you are covering your statutory duties. The current temporary planning protocols can remain in place to use if required under the scheme of delegation.

Members have reviewed the current bank procedures within Minute No: 39/21e.

Following discussion, it was proposed and seconded with all in favour and therefore,

Chairman's Report

This has been a hard year for everyone, and I am proud to be part of a community which has supported each other through these difficult times.

We started the new year with the St Erme Emergency Plan being activated, we never imagined that the 'Plan' would come into use for something like a 'Pandemic'. This helped a great deal as we already had over 72 volunteers registered on the plan. It was not very long before the clerk had over 30 additional people putting their names forward to help.

During the lock downs we helped with the collection of medication, shopping, and befriending those that were shielding or self-isolating. Trispen Post Office & Stores have been a great support to the village and community over the last twelve months and helped many residents with their shopping and listened to their concerns.

An initiative was set up called the 'Nova Post' where members of the community wrote letters, poems or drawings and artwork which was shared amongst those that registered.

The St Erme Playing Field Trust that runs the St Erme Community Centre obtained funding and set up the St Erme Community Larder to provide food for those that need it. This is still on-going with many families in the village receiving weekly supplies. I urge anyone that needs help to come forward and to contact the clerk. The 'Community Centre' have provided hot meals for the elderly and support with children's meals. They were able to make up 'Christmas Hampers' for the larder beneficiaries with donations received from Trispen Methodist Church and the St Erme Silver Circle along with supporting agencies and grants.

Local organisations, the elderly and young made masks, which helped with their health & wellbeing.

Children's activity packs were given out, these were distributed in the community and the materials were supplied by the St Erme Playing Field Trust funded by a grant.

I thank everyone in the community who have played their part whether it has been helping with the above or by just telephoning or checking up on your friends and neighbours.

Local businesses and organisations will need our support over the coming months, and it is important that we continue to use the services within our community that have supported us over the last year.

As a 'Council' we continued to run council business at first by delegating powers to the 'Clerk' supported by Councillors to carry out the day to day running of council business. We held our first remote Zoom meeting in May and have continued to hold our meetings this way through the pandemic allowing members of the public to join in and attend these meetings. This was a new experience for us all and I thank the members for allowing and making this happen by agreeing to meet in this way.

Through the year we have continued to respond to planning applications as a 'Statutory Consultee; and have been working with 'Burringtons' to address some outstanding items and to hopefully transfer the open space to the north of the site to the Parish Council.

Our scheme to reduce the speed limits in the parish to 20mph has been agreed through the "Truro & Roseland Community Network Area Highways Scheme", with most of the cost being funded by them. Work on this has been delayed due to the pandemic but should hopefully go to a 'Statutory Consultation' giving the community a chance to have your say. We are in the process of looking at an interactive mobile speed camera for the village that can be moved around to three locations. This will complement the scheme and help reduce the speed of traffic around the village.

This year we have employed an Environmental Enforcement Officer who is authorised by Cornwall Council to issue fixed penalty notices for dog fouling, littering and flyposting. Unfortunately, you find these sorts of issues in every community and are normally carried out by a small minority of people. Having our own enforcement officer allows us to decide when, where and how often they patrol our community.

We continue to serve the community to the best of our ability and listen and take on board comments and opinions received about various issues in the parish.

It is important that you continue to express your opinions and attend any consultations throughout the year; so we can represent the interests of the whole community.

I would like to thank you our community, the clerk, our Street Cleanser/ Environmental Enforcement Officer, the members of the council and Cllr Eathorne-Gibbons (Cornwall Councillor) for all your support, hard work and commitment in what has been a difficult twelve months.

15) To adopt the following revised scheme of delegation and Supplementary documents

SUPPLEMENTARY STANDING ORDERS

The Regulations made under s78 of Coronavirus Act 2020 apply and where there is a conflict between these and any other adopted standing orders or legislation, to take precedence in relation to the interruption of meetings able to take place due to the COVID 19 pandemic.

1) Access to Information

- a) Where a document is required to be 'open to inspection' this shall include published on the website of the council.
- b) Where a document is required to be published and made available at the council's offices, this shall include published on the website of the council.
- c) Where there is a requirement to publish information including public notices, agendas, minutes, background papers and written reports, this shall include published on the website of the council.

2) Public Access to Meetings

- a) The definition of meeting within the Council's standing orders is amended so that
 - i) where a meeting is open to the public, members of the public will be asked to register to attend meetings or forward comments on an agenda item by email to the Clerk. This is to regulate the number of attendees as per the COVID-19 capacity of the venue.

3) Scheme of Delegation

- a) A Scheme of delegation will be set up in the Council's Supplementary Financial Regulations so that
 - the Council can take necessary action with associated expenditure to protect the interests of the community and ensure council business continuity, informed by consultation with members of the council if the Council were unable to meet due to the COVID 19 pandemic.

The Supplementary Standing Orders will be reviewed no later than September 2021.

SUPPLEMENTARY FINANCIAL REGULATIONS

The Regulations made under s78 of Coronavirus Act 2020 apply and where there is a conflict between these and any other adopted standing orders or financial regulations. If the council are unable to meet due to the COVID-19 Pandemic the following procedures have been put in place.

1) Delegation of Expenditure

That the Council delegates authority to the Clerk in consultation with the Chairman, Vice Chairman or another member of the Council; to take any actions necessary with associated expenditure to protect the interests of the community and ensure council business continuity, informed by consultation with the members of the council.

2) Payments and On-line Banking

That the council authorise the clerk to continue as a single Full Access user of the council's on-line bank accounts during the period of the Coronavirus pandemic. Any electronic payments will be authorised by a schedule of payments that will be circulated and approved by members of the council by e-mail or meeting, for clerk to arrange payment electronically.

The scheme of delegation and supplementary Financial Regulations will be reviewed no later than September 2021.
